<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 14</p> <p>How did David show he did not seek Saul's life?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<p>David did not kill Saul when he had the opportunity to do so</p>
<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 14</p> <p>Why did David refuse to harm Saul?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<p>Saul was God's anointed (Samuel had anointed Saul in obedience to God)</p>
