<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 28</p> <p>Explain "prophetic perspective".</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<p>not overly concerned with time</p> <p>concerned with God's redemptive actions bringing together events that are really separated by time</p>
<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 28</p> <p>Relate the Book of Joel to "prophetic perspective".</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<p>plague of locusts is the beginning of a series of events — separated by time — ending in God's final judgment</p> <p>Joel does not show lapse of time, but illustrates how they are connected</p> <p>prophecy concerned with what God will do, not when He will do it</p>
