New pharaoh forgot about Joseph and only knew the Israelites were of the same racial background as the Hyksos. Reduced Israelites to slavery.</p>

Death of first-born.
Passover (later communion in the newer testament) was given as a way of escape. A lamb was sacrificed with its blood put on the doorposts and lintel. Sin must be removed by sacrifice. Passover Lamb points to Christ, the perfect Sacrifice.
