<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>What was the burnt offering?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) most common2) offered twice daily3) part of regular tabernacle worship4) sacrifice to be the best & without blemish5) worshipper laid hands on sacrifice (man's sin is transferred to the animal)6) sacrifice pays penalty of sin7) symbolized consecration of worshipper

<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>What was the meal offering?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<p>usually offered with the burnt offering because the meal offering did not remove sin</p> <p>offering was the fruit of the ground which symbolize the fruits of righteous</p> <p>offering symbolized consecration of holy living for the whole man</p>
<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>What was the peace offering?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<p>peace offering same as that for burnt offering until blood sprinkled the fat (tender parts) were burned breast and right shoulder given to priests - remainder given to worshipper to be eaten symbolizing communion and fellowship with God</p>
<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>What was the sin offering?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) for committing sin "in error" -- lack of knowledge or will power2) there was no sacrifice for one deliberately sinning3) animal sacrifice - poor could bring grain unmixed with oil or incense4) symbolized guilt taken away

<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>What was the trespass offering?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) closely connected to sin offering2) for sins invading God's rights or fellow man3) sacrifice was a ram, blood put on brass altar4) worshipper to return what he gained to the rightful owner plus 20% for damages5) shows not only must sin be covered but the importance of justice

<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>What did the sacrifices mean?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) animals cannot take away sin2) foreshadows Perfect Sacrifice yet to come3) we cannot fellowship with God until sins covered by Jesus shed blood4) our bodies are a living sacrifice

<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>What does the Day of Atonement mean?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) the entire nation gathered together2) sin offerings made for the high priest and the people3) blood from sacrifices taken to the holy of holies and sprinkled on the mercy seat4) foreshadows the work of Christ - He shed His blood in a perfect sacrifice and is before God for us

<p>Kingdom of God Chapter 7</p> <p>Why is there such emphasis on "clean" and "unclean"?</p> <p>© Beverly Schmitt, all rights reserved</p>	<p>unclean = pollution and being defiled (sin) clean = we must be made clean to enter into fellowship with God points to holiness holiness central to Leviticus</p>
