Now we know ...

Nouns = person, place, thing, idea

Verb = a word which expresses action or being

Adjective = colors and numbers

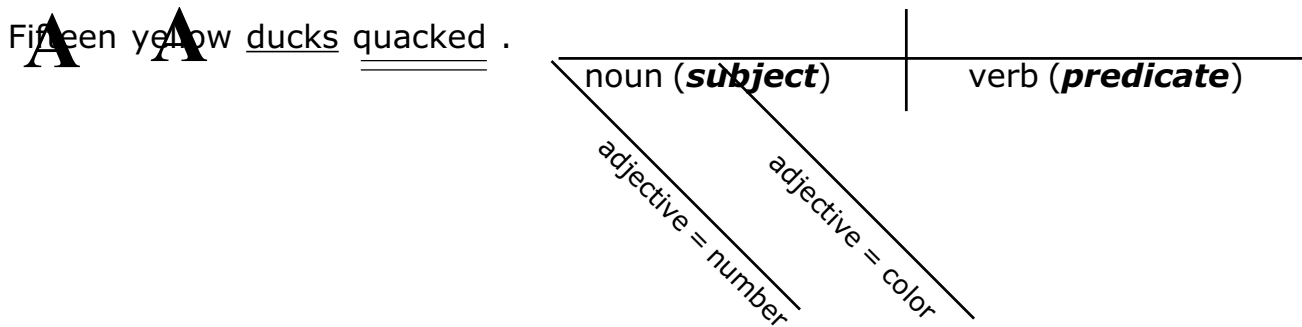
Diagramming Challenge

Ask what is fifteen? Answer: ducks

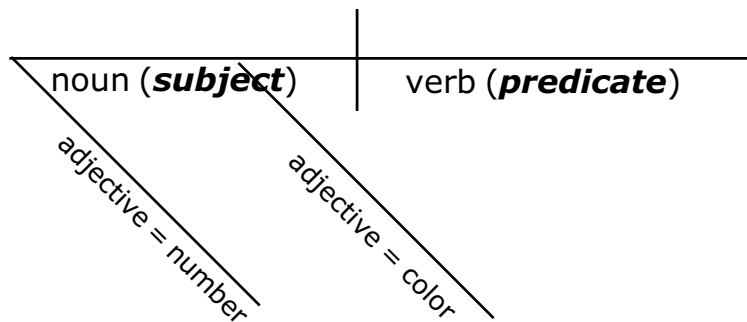
Ask what is yellow? Answer: ducks

With your green color pencil write the verb (**predicate**) on the diagram.

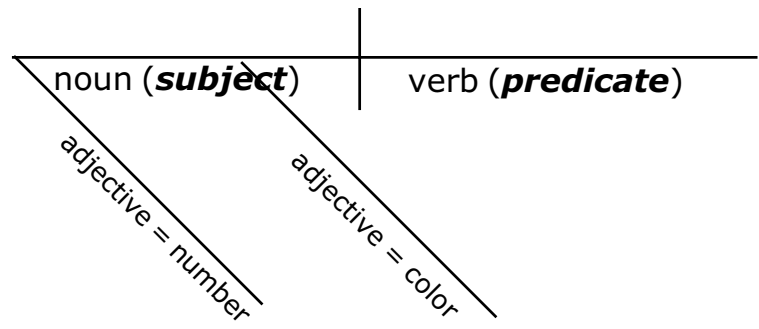
With your orange color pencil write the noun (**subject**) on the diagram.

With your sky blue color pencil write the two adjectives (number and color) on the diagram.

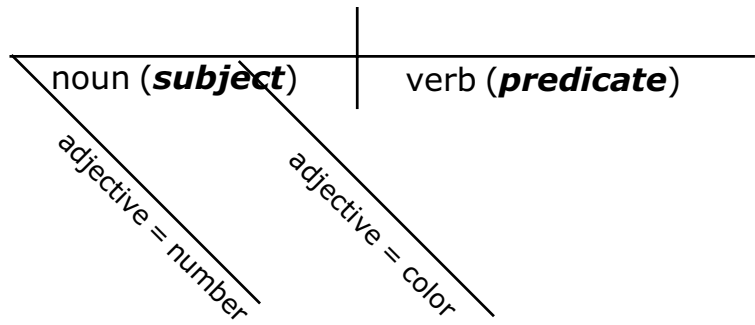
