Recommendations:

- 1) Place the “*to be*” verb conjugation that extends to two pages back to back and laminate them. Laminating the Conjugation Charts makes them much easier to use and will help them stand up to the usage your family puts them through!
- 2) Place the “*love*” conjugation and the *fill-in-the-blank conjugation with the verb of your choice* pages back to back and laminate them so they may be used over time.
- 3) Practice conjugating verbs 2-3 times per week. This need not take long ... only two or three minutes per session. However, you will find that this minimal exposure to conjugating verbs will stand your scholars in good stead.
- 4) Initially, coming up with verbs is fairly simple. However, over time you may become frustrated with thinking of new verbs. That is when referring to <http://www.lovetolearnplace.com> and looking under “Verbs” in the grammar section under Simple Grammar Games is extremely helpful.
- 5) Develop a sing-song voice while conjugating verbs. Think of how attentive children are when reciting well-beloved poems and rhymes in a sing-song voice. It makes conjugating verbs much more fun.

Special Notes

It should be observed that ...

1. The terms **shall** and **will** are used interchangeably. It will also help to remember that **shall** may also be substituted with **shalt**. (Thou shalt love the Lord thy God).
2. The singular form of **you are** may be used interchangeably with **thou art**. Becoming familiar with these terms will not only assist your scholar in reading the Bible, but will also prepare him/her for Shakespeare.
3. In the third person, the subject of the verb may be any of the personal pronouns, **he, she, it**, any of the relative pronouns, **who, which, what, that**, etc., or any noun. For the convenience of recitation, only one subject is inserted.
4. In the potential mode an auxiliary may be --

Present tense: **may**
can
must

Past Tense: **might**
could
would
should

Present-Perfect Tense: **may**
have
can have
must have
must have

Past-Perfect Tense: **might have**
could have
would have
should have
